## LETTER FROM THE CEO

It has been with great joy that 2022/2023 allowed Founding Director, Durga Aran back to Nepal, not only to oversee our education projects but to take on the construction of a new earthbag school in Nuwakot. Perched high on a ridge and accessed only by a very rough road, the villagers of Payunswara were overjoyed to hear that they would finally have a school for their young children. Until now the youngest children did not go to school as it was simply too far away to walk.

During Durga's two visits to Nepal he visited almost all our project schools, oversaw teacher training, coordinated volunteer builders and teachers and conducted leadership training for head teachers in Nuwakot.

We had a strong financial year with our highest ever total raised in the annual appeal thanks to the support of dedicated donors around the world. Our Friends of First Steps Himalaya also continued to provide vital funding.

Our 5-year capacity building programme allowed us to continue to streamline our processes and administration which in turn create smoother running of our organisation. Our team in Nepal continue to grow professionally and take on increasing responsibilities. Our aim is that our Nepal based partner organisation, First Steps Nepal is able to operate more independently by 2027.

I would like to thank our dedicated board of trustees, donors and everyone who contributed to our success this year. I wish I could take each and every one of you to see the changes that we are making in Nepal. Do remember that we do post updates almost daily on Facebook and publish regular newsletters which you can subscribe to. We are so grateful for the fantastic support we receive. Thank you!

## ABOUT FIRST STEPS HIMALAYA

First Steps Himalaya works in rural Nepali villages to provide early childhood development and quality education in schools. The majority of teachers in rural Nepal are untrained and ill-equipped to provide quality education, and work in schools that are often dilapidated, dirty, and lacking in resources. This results in a cycle of poverty with poorly educated children, growing up to become parents who know no other way.

Thanks to First Steps Himalaya's projects, young children who were once unattended, now learn in safe and nurturing child-friendly Hundreds environments. of children. in growing number а communities, now benefit from attending pre-school and primary classes with better trained teachers, in classrooms that are now clean, painted, and adequately resourced.

## SIGNIFICANT ACHIEVEMENTS 2022/2023

This has been a year of significant achievements, given that Director Durga Aran was finally able to return to Nepal.

#### THIS YEAR WE HAVE:

- Constructed one earthbag school in Nuwakot (partially complete) with four classrooms
- Run training courses for 102 teachers from 33 schools
- Our Nepal team made 164 supervisory visits to 21 schools in 3 districts
- Conducted English Language training for 25 teachers from 9 schools
- Conducted a menstrual hygiene programme for 94 girls in 3 schools
- Conducted a community resilience project in 9 villages in Nuwakot
- Published 2,000 copies of an English language children's story book set in Nepal.







#### EARLY YEARS TEACHER TRAINING


## This year we provided training courses for 102 teachers from 33 schools

A school is only four walls until there is quality teaching inside it, that encourages a love of learning in children.

First Steps trains teachers in modern professional teaching methods, appropriate to the children and their culture. Our effective, cutting edge and hands on teacher training courses support the long term professional development of teachers. Over time, they become trained in innovative and contemporary pedagogical methodologies. They are able to deliver effective learning outcomes for primary children under their care. Our practical hands on training courses aim to improve teachers' skills, motivation, enthusiasm and creativity.







#### **ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE TRAINING**

We provided English Language training for 25 teachers from 9 schools in Nuwakot.

Rural Nepali teachers are expected to follow an English Language Curriculum despite having very little English themselves,





### LEADERSHIP TRAINING

We conducted 5 leadership training sessions for 16 head teachers & deputy head teachers from 9 schools.

Positive change in schools is largely dependent on the school leadership who need to be motivated and enthusiastic as school leaders. Our leadership training looks at different styles of leadership and identifies strengths and weaknesses in order to be more effective.





#### SCHOOL MONITORING

## Our Nepal team made 164 supervisory visits to 21 schools in 3 districts

A vital part of our programme is visiting teachers in their own classrooms following teacher training. During these visits, we rate the quality of the teaching, the use of resources, the classroom and the school's external environment. We introduce new ideas to teachers and make suggestions as to how the classroom could be improved.





### MENSTRUAL HYGIENE MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME

We conducted a menstrual hygiene management programme for 94 teenage girls in 3 schools.

The programme aimed to help girls feel confident to attend school whilst menstruating. It showed there is clearly a need for improved awareness around menstruation for adolescent girls in rural Nepal and that school toilet facilities do not support girls in feeling comfortable and clean while menstruating at school. The programme included reusable pad making demonstrations, talks about menstruation, assessment of toilet and disposal facilities and workshops with teachers so that they could better support the girls.





#### **COMMUNITY RESILIENCE PROGRAMME**

We conducted parent education talks and village clean up campaigns in 9 communities.

The Community Resilience Programme aimed to build community resilience in the Nuwakot area during the rapidly changing situation of Nepal as a result of the COVID-19 global situation that impacted every day life in poor rural communities.

This year, the end of project survey measured the changes from the start of the programme period. It showed that the communities had become much more self reliant, hygiene had vastly improved and production of vegetables in kitchen gardens had increased. People became far more aware of the importance of hygiene and helped each other more.







#### **EARTHBAG BUILD**

Following a request from Payunswara Community, Nuwakot, we embarked on an earthbag project to construct a school for young children in the village. A team of international volunteers worked alongside local villagers to build 4 classrooms from earth, stone and metal rebar. Construction began in March and is due to be completed in October 2023.










### **CHILDREN'S STORY BOOK**

We published 2,000 copies of Sita's Search and distributed books to 24 schools

There is a lack of culturally appropriate English language story books in Nepal. Chairperson Nicola Crawford wrote Sita's Search about a little Nepali girl who meets several children who for several reasons are not able to attend school. The story captures the attention of young children and is written in simple English.



### CAPACITY BUILDING

This year we conducted English language training and team building activities as part of this programme.

The capacity building project is well underway. We continue to refine and improve our administrative systems and processes which contribute to the smoother running of our operations in Nepal. This will continue to impact the quality of our service delivery and in turn the lives of the children that we serve.

Our Nepal team have been working on English Language skills with particular focus on report writing. Our first team building retreat in Pokhara was a fantastic opportunity to bring the staff together for a few days outside their normal working environment. The result was a greater sense of team spirit, gain in confidence and developing skills.









## SCHOOL PROJECT UPDATE

Across Nepal, our team works one-on-one with early years teachers in selected schools. Our team mentors the teachers and monitors improvements on a regular basis. Below are some recent photographs of these schools.

#### SINDHUPALCHOK PROJECTS

We have been working in this areas since 2009. Our ECD centre at Sangachok Nursery is not only the longest running but the most successful project serving as a model for other schools in the area. Siranchour, Jitpur and Mulkharka schools have also excelled this year.
