#### TOP TIPS AND HANDY HINTS

#### Get the most out of your campaign!

Every dollar you, your family, friends and colleagues raise makes a huge difference in improving the education for young rural Nepali children.

Here is some practical advice to make the most of your fundraising campaign.



Set a fundraising target. This is a great way to motivate yourself. The higher the target, the more people usually give.

If fundraising online – ask your generous friends and family to donate first. This encourages other people to donate larger amounts later on.

# Double your Money!

Check whether your employer runs a matched-giving scheme. They may offer to double the amount of money you raise.

If not, ask whether they would like to make a donation to support your fundraising campaign.

### Shout out!

Let lots of people know about your fundraiser and ask for their support.

Use Social Media and email to share your campaign, tell your friends, family and colleagues what you're doing and why.

## Create a Team!

If you are organsing an event, get a team of people to help you. No event should be organised by one person.

Create a written plan and delegate certain jobs to the people in your team. Organise regular meetings with your team to make sure everything is running smoothly.

Get the most out of your campaign!

### Ask for help!

Ask local businesses to donate items you need for your event. Businesses are often very happy to help. Here are some things local business could provide for free:

- A venue for your event
- Vouchers and products for a raffle or auction
- Food or drink for your event

The advantage for the business is free advertising to their target market. Try brainstorming businesses that might want access to your supporters. For example if the people coming to your event are parents of pre-schoolers, you could ask an educational toy company to sponsor the event or donate a prize.

# Keep it legal and safe!

You'll be responsible for getting any permits, licenses or any other approval for your event. You'll also need to carry out necessary risk assessments and stick to health and safety requirements.

Raffles and prize draws are governed by legislation, so make sure to check the law before going ahead.

### Follow up!

Always, always follow up with potential product sponsors or people who've said they will donate cash. People lead busy lives, it's all too easy for them to forget that they agreed to help.

# Turn a little into a lot!

When telling people about your fundraising campaign, share our website address. This lets other people know about our work and, who knows, perhaps they will start their own fundraising campaign too!

If you are selling things, such as a bake sale – have a donation box handy. Generous people will put their change in the donation box.

Sometimes, local businesses may donate small items and vouchers for your campaign. These can be grouped together to form a larger gift basket for a raffle or auction.

We empower our rural Nepali teachers to create simple, engaging lesson plans. We teach them how to make their own classroom resources from things they can find in their village.


Teachers learn the importance of play in young children's development and encourage kind behaviour management techniques.

#### **Tips for Collecting Donations Online**

The easiest way to ask family and friends to sponsor you is by setting up an Online Fundraising page.

Online fundraising pages such as Givealittle or GoFundMe make it really easy for people to donate.



### Step 1

Choose your preferred Online Fundraising platform.

If you are based in New Zealand, go to the fundraising website Givealittle and select First Steps Himalaya as your charity.

### Step 2

Follow the instructions to set up your campaign.

You'll need a Campaign name, description and a photo.

### Step 3

Once your page is set up, start telling people about it.

Email the link to your friends and family, put the link on your Facebook page and shout out on other Social media platforms.

Online Fundraising is easier for you as you don't need to collect cash donations.

#### **GET INVOLVED**

#### INSPIRATIONAL FUNDRAISING IDEAS

Every dollar you, your family, friends and colleagues raise makes a huge difference in improving the education for young rural Nepali children.

You can do anything to raise money!

One of the best pieces of advice we can give you is that nothing is too small to make a difference. Here are a few ideas from our wonderful supporters around the world!

### Sports and Adventure

#### Fitness Challenge

Challenge your friends to a fitness challenge. It is easy to organize and doesn't involve gathering people together.

Challenge them to complete a certain distance every day. This could be a 5km walk or run, a 15 km bike ride or a 1km swim. They must do this every day for the entire month.

For every day that they don't complete the challenge, they pay an agreed fine. This is a great way to raise money and get fit at the same time.

#### Trek

Trek the Himalayas and ask your friends and family to donate money when you reach your trekking goals. First Steps Himalaya has a sister company, Beyond The Clouds Travel which supports our charity work.

Trek through Nepal's high mountain passes, or go on a walking holiday in beautiful Bhutan www.beyondtheclouds.org.nz

#### Run a halfmarathon

Ask your friends and family to sponsor you and donate money when you reach your training goals.





# GET INVOLVED Kids, Kindergartens and Schools

#### **Bake Sale**

This classic is great for kids. Organise donations of home baking and sell to your school community or at your local market. Make sure you have lots of small coins and notes to use as change on the day.

Children can create hand-made banners and posters to advertise their stall and charity work. Plants, second- hand toys and clothes can also work well.

#### **Fun with Coins**

Make the donated coins part of the event. Create a trail of coins across your playground and record the distance the coins trail covers.

Or you can use chalk to draw an outline of an image such as a smiling face, or the Nepal flag, then try to cover all the lines with coins.

#### **Teddy Bears Picnic**

Bring your favourite teddy bear from home and have a shared lunch with your playgroup, kindergarten or class. Kids donate a coin to participate.

## Mufti / non-uniform day

Wear casual clothes for the day or dress up in a chosen colour (for example hold an orange day). Charge a small amount for children to take part.

# GET INVOLVED At Home

#### **Afternoon Tea**

Host guests for an afternoon tea party and ask them to donate.

## International Food challenge

Invite your guests around for an evening of food judging and fun. Assign each guest the challenge of bringing a plate of food to share based on the cuisine of a specific country.

Have your guests judge each offering based on presentation, flavour and likeness to the country of origin.

#### Garage Sale or Car Boot Sale

Clear out your cupboards and sell your clutter at a Garage Sale. This is a great fundraiser that can be done on your own or with your friends, neighbours and colleagues.

# At Work Auction the Boss

Fancy having your boss make you coffee, run your errands and load the work dishwasher for the day? Auction your boss to the highest bidder while giving generously and having a laugh at work.

#### **Donation Box**

Simply put a donation box on the counter of your shop or business. You'd be surprised at how generous your customers are – especially if you feel passionate about the cause and share this with them.











# GET INVOLVED At Work

#### Donate an hour's salary

Ask your colleagues to donate an hours salary to help educate children in Nepal.

## Themed Dinner or Work Party

Decorate a local hall or your workplace with a chosen theme, such as 1920s or the Wild West, or book tables at a restaurant for the evening. Charge guests a ticket price to cover your costs as well as a bit extra for the charity.

Get as much donated as possible such as drinks and charge your guests by the glass. Requires time to plan and a budget.

#### Fancy Dress for the day

Charge a small amount for people to take part, dressing up in the theme you've chosen. Super heroes anyone?

#### **Quiz Night**

Organise a quiz evening and charge a ticket price for teams to enter. Have a competition, silent auction or raffle on the night to boost the amount raised. Ask local businesses to donate items and vouchers.
